### ***Prayer in Honour of Bishop Daniel Delany founder of the Patrician Brothers***

#### **Introductory Reading**

Bishop Daniel Delany was born in Ireland in 1747.  
Because of English laws in Ireland he had to study for  
the priesthood in France. When he was ordained, he

stayed in France and taught Theology to other young men studying to be priests.  
He returned to Ireland in 1776 and was consecrated bishop in 1783. His dream was  
to renew the people in his diocese of Carlow in their Catholic faith and practices.

To help him with this he founded the Brigidine Sisters in 1807 and the Patrician  
Brothers in 1808.

It was on his deathbed in 1814 that he left the Sisters and Brothers with the  
exhortation to love God and to live together in peace and charity.

#### **Bishop Delany and Trusting in God**

In his history of Bishop Delany and the Patrician Brothers, Brother Dermott Dunne  
writes on Fr Delany's return to Ireland from France:

He [Fr Daniel Delany] came, he saw, and he wished to return to France... So great  
was the moral disorder arising from the maelstrom of iniquitous social conditions  
that Fr Delany, depressed and despairing of effecting any good, decided, in order to  
save his own soul, to return to France... [His] mother asked, entreated [him to stay],  
and her son remained in Ireland... He had no illusions as to the magnitude of the  
evils to be overcome, but he had the consoling promise, "I am with you all days".

### Maxims Attributed to Bishop Delany

(After every second saying the reader pauses for a few moments and then says: And so we proclaim. To which all respond: Our help is in the name of the Lord.)

~ Love God and live together in peace and charity.

~ The Cross is the sure way to find Christ.

Pause - L: And so we proclaim A: Our help is in the name of the Lord.

~ The force of love will convert the hard wood of the Cross into a bed of roses.

~ Do everything in a spirit of holy love and you will not find your hands empty at journey's end.

Pause - L: And so we proclaim....

~ It is not, my dear children, God's consolations but God himself you should seek.

~ What you are those who come after you will be: the fountain should itself be pure in order to have the stream pure.

Pause - L: And so we proclaim..

~ From every seed sown and cultivated by pure love we shall be sure to reap a harvest of endless glory.

~ Never entertain yourself or others in speaking of another's faults or failings. You should be no less careful to draw a veil over these than if they actually belonged to yourself.

Pause - L: And so we proclaim.... A: Our help is in the name of the Lord

~ For you holiness will not consist in doing great actions, but in doing your least actions with great purity of intention and a genuine desire to please God.

~ By performing the ordinary duties of your day well you will perfect yourself, and your day will be full of merit and good works.

Pause - L: And so we proclaim....

~ We cannot possibly stand still in the career of Christian virtue. Not to advance on this road is to recede. Not to go up against the torrent is to be carried down by it. Labour, therefore, with might and main and in full assurance of the Divine assistance, to be daily and hourly advancing in this blessed race.

Pause - L: And so we proclaim A: Our help is in the name of the Lord
