Introductory Reading

A Gathering Prayer

A Reflective Prayer on the Breastplate

Readers 1 & 2: Christ in the heart of everyone who speaks to me

1. Christ, make me attentive to the word,
2. that I may hear the word.
1. Christ, make me listen to the other,
2. that I may hear the other.
1. Christ when words fail and communication breaks down,
2. You are still there to keep us together.

*ALL: Christ, let me hear you
in the voice of a friend,
in the chatter of a child,
in the utterances of the mute,
in the words of a stranger.*



Readers 3 & 4: Christ in the eyes of everyone that sees me

3. Christ, let me see You in others. Christ, let others see You in me.
4. Christ, let me see You: as the caller, as the poor, as the stranger.
3. You are the wanderer, the unfed.
4. You are the homeless, with no bed.
3. You are the other who comes to me
4. Open my eyes that I may see.

*ALL: Christ, grant that in me others may see:
Your glory, Your grace, Your goodness, Your presence.
We have been created in the image of God.*

Readers 5 & 6: Christ in the ear that hears me

5. Christ, You are there before I speak,
6. Help me to respect You.
5. Christ, You are present in the listener,
6. Let me reveal You.
5. Christ, may my words not hide
6. You the Word.

*ALL: Christ is here, Christ is there,
Christ is everywhere.
Christ above, Christ below,
Christ along the path I go.*
